πρόγνωσις, εως, ἡ advance knowledge, foreknowledge, what is known ahead of time

Acts 2:23 τοῦτον τῇ ὀρισμένη βουλῇ καὶ προγνώσει τοῦ θεοῦ ἕκδοτον διὰ χειρὸς ἀνόμων προσπήξαντες ἀνείλατε,	Acts 2:23 this <i>Man</i> , delivered up by the predetermined plan and foreknowledge of God, you nailed to a cross by the hands of godless men and put <i>Him</i> to death.	noun dative feminine singular	Peter preaching to the crowd on Pentecost says that Christ was delivered up to death by the “predetermined plan and foreknowledge of God,” employing the Granville-Sharp construction	Christ’s death was foreknown by God
